Singapura, director, composer, performer, teacher and an all rounded multiinstrumentalist.

A firm believer of continuous learning, Syed Ahmad was under the tutelage of various Brazilian percussion masters and exchanged ideas with Brazilian music legends like João Donato, Dudu

Tucci and Maninho 'Z10' Costa.





Syed Ahmad's musical journey has seen him perform with international artists such as Trilok Gurtu, Chico Cesar, Billy Cobham, and Rio Carnaval champions, Escola de Samba Beija-Flor de Nilopolis.

His efforts and passion have attracted the attention of the media, most notably, a

documentary by Brazilian television station, Sistema Brasileiro de Televisão and Suria channel's documentary programme, DNA, as one of Singapore's inspiring individuals and art activist.

With an impressive list of accomplishments, Syed Ahmad still stays close to the community by bringing music to the young through educational programmes.

PROFESSOR CAPETA BAY AREA

Professor Capeta is

a cofounder of the Capoeira Collective Bay Area, working in sharing and making capoeira more accessible to the wider community.

Professor Capeta's capoeira journey started in 2000 when he was drawn into the Capoeira Arts Cafe in Berkeley, California. He observed the classes of Mestres Acordeon and Suelly and was intrigued with the movement and music percolating through this amazing space. Having moved from the highlands of Jalisco just a couple of years prior,

he eventually found his community within the

Capoeira Mandinga group in Oakland. He was training under the auspices of Mestre Marcelo Pereira and after 12 years of training, graduated as Professor in 2015. During this formatura, he along with his turma brought together dozens of teachers and hundreds of students from all around the world and hosted one of the most inspiring events in the recent SF Bay Area history. Today, Professor Capeta is a cofounder of the Capoeira Collective Bay Area and working collaboratively with

Mestre Bengala and the wider Bay Area capoeira community in sharing and making capoeira more accessible to the wider community.

"Capoeira for me has been a catalyst for health and community. I love that this artform has brought people together and allows for us to experience and communicate with each other through movement and songs."

Professor Capeta currently lives in Oakland, California with his partner of 14 years (Donna/ Instrutora Algodao), 9 yo daughter (Maya "Na Veia"), 12yo Oakland Terrier (Chupacabra) and 2 cats (Morena and Chismes).
